# SOME 2019 GBBC DATA

Several LHAS members participated in the 2019 Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) held in February. The GBBC Webside contains lots of data on the count. Listed below are just a few items that might be of interest.

Total number of species found was 6,732.

Total U.S. species found was 674.

Total Iowa species found was 95.

Scott county led Iowa counties with 54 speciesl.

Woodbury county ranked 11th in Iowa counties with 37 species.

Columbia had the most species with 1095.

California had the most checklists with 10,059.

The Northern Cardinal was the most frequently reported species.

The Red-winged Blackbird was the most numerous species with 4,290,218 birds counted.

Total birds counted was 32,093,344!

#### Loess Hills Audubon Society Bird-A-Thon—May 2019 by Paul Roisen—Bird-A-Thon Czar

An introduction might be necessary since the Bird-A-Thon Czar, to the best of my knowledge, has always been Chuck Johnson—ably assisted by Donna Popp the last eleven years. It was a surprise and an honor to be asked by them to take over this important Loess Hills Audubon Society (LHAS) position. Even though I am a "johnny come lately" to the LHAS, I can only say this organization has played a very large part in my growth as a bird watcher and a conservationist. I am thrilled to be able to give something back. Please take time to thank both Chuck and Donna for the many years of service with this great project.

What is a bird-a-thon? The Bird-A-Thon is a fundraiser much like a walk-a-thon. You do NOT have to be a bird expert or even count birds to be able to participate. Our focus is to raise awareness and money for conservation projects in a fun way—counting bird species.

Goals: Raise money so that Loess Hills Audubon Society (LHAS) is able to fund more projects related to conservation. This may be through education or ongoing projects or even new conservation activities and projects. Increase the number of people involved in this year's LHAS Bird-A-Thon and future events.

When: May 10-13, 2019--We are making participation more flexible. Do a portion of a day, a full day, or all four days if you wish.

How can YOU help?

- 1. KEY is engaging as many people as possible, especially new people, to give financially and/or of there time to this event.
- 2. Method: Pledge to the LHAS Bird-A-Thon—a lump sum, a per species pledge (like \$1 per species—you can set a max with maybe \$5 for each owl) etc. You may chose to pledge support to: an individual or a team or sending support directly to the Bird-A-Thon. Count birds and solicit donations from friends, family, your boss, neighbors, an organization, or a business.
- 3. Process: Teams and Individuals will be asked to encourage friends, family, your boss, neighbors, an organization, or a business to pledge lump sums or an amount based on the number of species the individual or the team finds. Individuals and teams will then go out and try to find as many different species as they can find and raise as much money as they can for a great cause. Anytime from May 10 through May 13, 2019, bird anywhere you wish and report your results to those who pledged to support you AND to the Bird-A-Thon Czar
